

Joint PhD research opportunity

The research area of interest is around **priority setting in health care** with a particular focus on **rationing and disinvestment**.

The studentship will be a joint post hosted by the University of Birmingham and University of British Columbia, Canada institutions which offer thriving and supportive research cultures. The successful candidate will undertake research at both host organisations, spending year 1 and 3 at the University of Birmingham and year 2 at the University of British Columbia, Canada. On successful completion of the PhD, the candidate will receive a jointly awarded PhD under the U21 Memorandum of Agreement on joint PhDs.

We are looking to recruit someone who has a postgraduate qualification in a relevant discipline and/or experience of working in a health care management role. This studentship will include full payment of fees at the UK/EU level. The successful applicant will receive an enhanced stipend which, in 2010/2011, will be £13,590 per annum. All tuition fees will also be paid at the UK/EU rate.
