

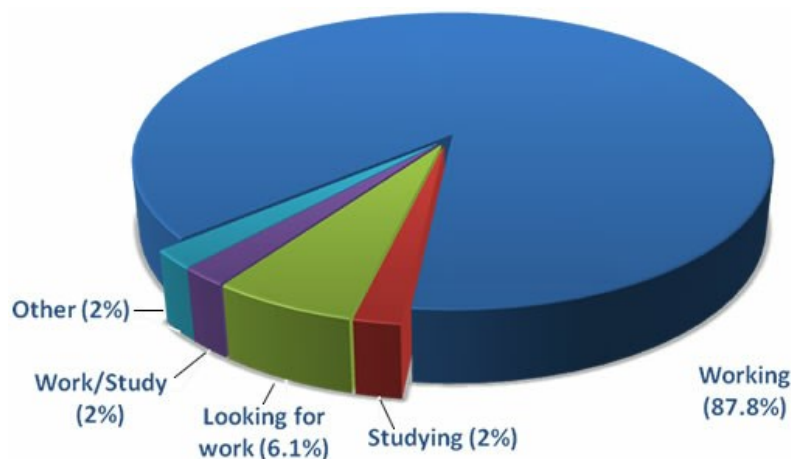
Physiotherapy graduate career opportunities
