

Graduate career opportunities

The School has an excellent record of employment, with over 87% of our Sport, Physical Education and Coaching Sciences graduates in graduate-level jobs or postgraduate study six months after graduation (DLHE 2012/13 data). These statistics reflect the strong reputation of the School and the wide range of employability skills on offer in our multi-disciplinary degree programmes.

The DLHE survey is conducted 6 months after graduation.

What do Sport, Physical Education and Coaching Science graduates do?

The majority of Sport, Physical Education and Coaching Science graduates work within a wide range of sport, coaching, fitness and leisure, sport development, school and community contexts, with fewer graduates entering commercial roles (in comparison to sport and exercise science graduates). A number of students choose to pursue further study, with most going on to study postgraduate teaching qualifications in both primary and secondary subjects, and other courses are related to improving their specialist sport or health skill-set or retraining in another industry.

This report contains analysis of destinations data for the University of Birmingham's Sport, Physical Education and Coaching Science graduates who completed their course in 2011/12, based on the Destinations of Leavers from Higher Education (DLHE) survey.
