### What are your career experiences since graduating from the University of Birmingham?

I firstly got a Physiotherapist assistant job at South Birmingham PCT working with children with learning disabilities, this was a team I knew as I had a student placement during my team which probably helped me to get the job. After doing this for six months I got my first Junior Physiotherapy post at University Hospital Birmingham in June 2006. This was an excellent experience and provided me with a wide range of rotations covering all things from Respiratory and Military Trauma to Sporting Injuries and care of the Elderly. I left this post in December 2008 after 2.5 years as a Junior to take up a post as a Specialist Advisor at Ingeus, Workdirections which is in the private sector. This was a tough decision but the new job has provided an interesting change as it involves providing advice, education and rehabilitation for clients who are on health related benefits and looking to improve their function in order to return to work. I also started working three days per week for Aston Villa Football Club in August 2008 as an Academy physiotherapist, this has provided me we extra exposure to the treatment and prevention of sporting injuries working with young athletes.

Seeing a huge variety of patient groups and the freedom to continue to change the type of work within this profession.
