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### About

Catherine Hale is an influential legal expert on issues related to health care, particularly current or topical ethical issues. As a regular speaker at external events and media commentator she has provided lectures and commentary on key health care and legal issues.

She is a key player in the medical undergraduate curriculum having both extensive management committee membership and teaching responsibilities. Her role within the Medical School is to not only give students an understanding of their legal obligations but also to equip them with the ethical reasoning skills and personal qualities in order to achieve appropriate standards of conduct.

As such she is an Associate of the Integrated Studies Unit, within the Department of Primary Care and General Practice, which specialises in how to communicate with patients effectively in clinical practice. She is also a member of the Institute of Medical Law, Law School, University of Birmingham, an Associate of The Institute of Clinical Leadership, University of Warwick and Consultant to the Ministry of Defence.

### Biography

Catherine originally came to the Centre for Biomedical Ethics based within Primary Care Clinical Sciences at the University of Birmingham in 1998 as a part-time post-graduate student, whilst working as a lecturer part-time teaching health care ethics as well as law, including professional legal qualifications for solicitors, legal executives and paralegals.

Upon completing her MSc in Health Care Ethics in 2000 she obtained a full-time lectureship in Medical Law and Ethics at the University of Birmingham and is now a Senior Lecturer within the Medicine, Ethics, Society and History (MESH) group. During her career at the University of Birmingham she has taught and administered a wide variety of programmes particularly within the Medical School and continues to specialise in medical law, combining her previous clinical experience especially as a transplant co-ordinator, with her considerable teaching and legal expertise.

### Teaching

Catherine continues to be a key player in the medical undergraduate curriculum. Her current University teaching management responsibilities include: Deputy Lead & Member of Special Study Component Management Group MBChB 1-5; Member of MBChB Phase 1 Management Group, Phase 1 MBChB Committee, MBChB 5 Committee, and GEC Committee. She is Module Co-ordinator for MBChB2 Medicine in Society: Decision Making Module, Special Project Module Crime and Medicine, compulsory final year Special Study Module in Ethics and Law, and Discipline Strand Lead for the Graduate Entry Programme.

She continues to be involved with post-graduate teaching and mentoring in law, ethics and personal development across the University, including on the following programmes: MSc (Health Sciences), MSc in Corporate Governance and Corporate Social Responsibility (Business School) Continuing Professional Development-dentists (Dental School), Continuing Professional Development- GPs (Department of Primary Care and General practice).
