Helen has had a special interest in the use of theatre as a learning tool from a young age. After graduating from University in 1997 she began her career working as a teacher/actor for Birmingham based Theatre in Education Company 'Language Alive!' As a core company member Helen was responsible for devising and delivering interactive Theatre in Education programmes for young people aged between 4 and 18. After four years Helen left Language Alive! to pursue a freelance career where she used her Applied Theatre skills and experience to secure a diverse range of work.

Her most notable freelance work includes 'Headspin' a teaching resource that uses drama to look at countering stigma and discrimination associated with mental illness (NZ Mental health Foundation), 'Ads Up' a sexual health awareness & breastfeeding campaign with young mums (Hi8us Media), 'Diversity Matters' Equality & Diversity Training for Birmingham City Council Employees (Dramatic Solutions Ltd) and 'The Experiment' an interactive six week drama around ethics and genetics for year nine pupils (Creative Partnerships).

Helen is a firm believer in the power of using drama as a learning method and it is this belief that led her to become a role player for the Interactive Studies Unit (ISU) working with medical and dental students. After four years of role playing she was keen to take up a more permanent role within the teaching team and applied for the post of senior teacher.

Helen is keen to further employ her applied theatre methodology to medical education and strives to find new and innovative ways to engage the health care professionals of the future.
