My main teaching and research interests are in 20th and 21st century Spanish literature and cinema, although I have also an interest in the works of Jose Saramago, Felisberto Hernandez and the Spanish philosopher María Zambrano. Currently I am working on Spanish Republican Exile and the literature of the Spanish Civil War.

Biography

I studied for my undergraduate degree at the University of Glasgow before moving on to take my PhD at the University of Salford. I spent 9 years teaching Spanish in a tertiary college in Wales before taking up a post as Lecturer in Spanish at the University of Kent in 1990 where I was Head of Spanish until 2000. From 2000- 2004 I was Dean of the Faculty of Humanities at Kent. I moved to Birmingham in January 2005, where I have been Head of Department and Head of School. I have worked closely with **Centro de Estudios Senderianos** (http://www.iea.es/000_estructura/index.php?id=51) in Huesca and Grupo de **Estudios del Exilio Literario** (<http://www.gexel.es/>) in Barcelona.

In 2008, a group of colleagues from the Department of Hispanic Studies and I set up a **Centre for the Study of Hispanic Exile** (<http://www.hispanic.bham.ac.uk/research/exilestudies/>). In the same year we ran a very successful international conference on **Spanish Republican Exile Geographies** (<http://www.hispanic.bham.ac.uk/research/exilestudies/2008conference.shtml>). I also organised a colloquium and exhibition entitled 'The United Kingdom in the Life and works of Camilo José Cela' in association with the **Fundación Cela** (<http://www.fundacioncela.com/>). This was in recognition of the University of Birmingham being one of the first to offer Spain's Nobel Prize winning novelist with an Honorary Doctorate in 1976.

Postgraduate supervision

I would be delighted to supervise students in a variety of areas relating to Spanish literature and culture of the XX and XXI centuries, in particular the literature of the avant-garde, Spanish Republican Exile and the Spanish Civil War.

Research

My main research interests are in 20th century Hispanic narrative, in particular the avant-garde novel of the 1920's, the social novel of the 1930's, and the literature of the Republican exiles. In these areas he has published work on Benjamín Jarnés, Ramón J. Sender, Manuel Andújar and, more recently, the philosopher María Zambrano. He has also published articles on the Uruguayan writer Felisberto Hernández and the Portuguese novelist José Saramago. More recently he has taken an interest in film and visual culture and has published an article on the film *La lengua de las mariposas*. He has just completed work on a critical edition of Sender's *La esfera* and is currently working on a Dictionary of Modern Spanish Literature and on a monograph on Spanish Civil War literature. He has delivered papers at conferences in the UK, Spain, Portugal, France, Germany, USA, New Zealand and Mexico.

Other activities

Prof. Lough is Director of the **Centre for the Study of Hispanic Exile** (<http://www.hispanic.bham.ac.uk/galician/index.shtml>) created in 2007. He is also director of the **Centro de Estudos Galegos** (<http://www.hispanic.bham.ac.uk/galician/centro.shtml>) and since 2007 has been editor of the journal **Galician Review** (<http://www.hispanic.bham.ac.uk/galician/review.shtml>).

He is currently working with Peter Lang Press as editor of a new book series titled *Iberian and Latin American Studies: The Arts, Literature and Identity*.
