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About

I have been a lecturer in the Department of Modern Languages (Hispanic Studies) since 1994. I teach medieval Spanish literature and Spanish language and linguistics. My research interests lie in the fields of medieval Spanish history and historiography, textual editing, diachronic phonology and syntax.

Teaching

At undergraduate level I teach courses on Linguistics and the languages of the Spanish-speaking world and on medieval literature and culture. At postgraduate level I contribute to Masters courses on Medieval Iberia and textual criticism and editing.

Postgraduate supervision

I have supervised postgraduate research at both Masters and Doctoral level on a range of topics. My principal area of interest is Medieval Iberia. I have also supervised work on language and politics in contemporary Spain, with particular reference to the minorised languages of the Peninsula, and (in conjunction with members of the English Department) language and discursive strategies in modern Castilian.

Research

My current research focuses on the discursive strategies employed in the construction of medieval histories. In particular, I am interested in the relationship between the writing of histories and the range of contexts that contribute to their construction and consumption.
