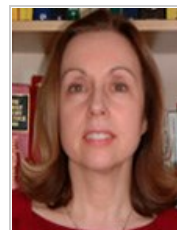

Biography

Moira Wright is a graduate of the University of Wales and received a BCL from the University of Oxford. She helped establish links between the Law School and Birmingham Medical School and the School of Nursing and served on the ethical and law training boards of both schools, as well as teaching their undergraduates. She is a Barrister and a practising family law mediator.
