Tarsem is a Social Work Lecturer and Associate Director at the **Centre of Excellence in Interdisciplinary Mental Health (CEIMH)**. (<http://www.ceimh.bham.ac.uk>) In 2011 Tarsem was awarded a Birmingham University Teaching Fellowship in recognition of his wide ranging and significant interventions in learning and teaching across the institution. In his work across the institution he serves on the Board of the Valuing Teaching at Birmingham initiative, the University Learning Environment Group and the University Massive Online Open Courses (MOOC) Steering Group.

Tarsem has been instrumental in developing innovative learning approaches such as his **mobile phone/tablet app** (<https://sites.google.com/site/socialworksocialmedia/>) to help social workers explore how to navigate the ethical issues of using social media in social work. Tarsem's research interests include the exploring potential of enquiry-based blended learning for interdisciplinary professional education, the impact of mobile technologies on the development of professional practice and the use of asynchronous learning technologies in encouraging professional reflection.
