In research Marianne's main focus has been on the evaluation of new educational initiatives in the form of interprofessional learning activities. She leads the evaluation group for the CITEC IPL project and have been involved in the development of student evaluation questionnaires. Further evaluation of the use of video feedback as a teaching and learning tool is planned. As part of the project team, she is currently involved in the analysis of evaluation questionnaires and student interviews for two forthcoming publications. She completed her MSc dissertation in 2009 on student attitudes to interprofessional learning. Marianne has also been a key player in local, national and international dissemination activities relating to this work.

### Other activities

As a clinical tutor, she is involved in liaison with staff at a number of local NHS trusts in their support of students, and preparation and support of students on practice placements. Marianne also has a keen interest in interprofessional learning (IPL). Since joining the university she has been involved in a number of innovations in IPL, working with colleagues from other areas of the college, and partner higher education institutions.
