3. To consider the education aspects of Vice-Chancellor's Reviews in order to initiate follow-up action.
4. To oversee the National Student Survey and Birmingham Student Satisfaction Survey including developing action plans based on the results of the surveys and ensuring their implementation.
5. To ensure that there is appropriate input into the Learning Spaces Strategy and its implementation.
6. To monitor and recommend appropriate developments to learning resources, including library provision and e-learning.
7. To have oversight of initiatives to provide learner development and employer engagement.
8. To encourage the development of interdisciplinary initiatives in learning and teaching.
9. To receive and consider reports from College Education Committees.
10. To promote innovation in learning, teaching and assessment, including the allocation and monitoring of the University's spend of teaching quality enhancement funds, and the dissemination of good practice.
11. To receive and consider reports from the Programme Approval Review Committee.
12. To receive and consider reports from the Learning Environment Group.
13. To receive and consider reports from the Student Access and Progress Committee.
