### Barber Institute of Fine Arts

You can experience some of the finest art in Europe on our Edgbaston campus every day of the week by visiting our world-renowned Barber Institute of Fine Arts with its impressive collection of works by some of history's greatest artists including Monet, Van Gogh, Botticelli, Degas, Picasso and Magritte, the collection has been described as one of the finest small art galleries in the world. A constantly changing array of visiting artwork and exhibitions makes the Barber Institute a lively and vibrant gallery. ### Lapworth Museum of Geology

Our Lapworth Museum of Geology has been designated as an 'Outstanding Collection' by the Arts and Humanities Research Council. You are welcome to explore our 250,000 specimens including rocks, fossils and minerals. We also house a separate collection of some 15,000 minerals. ### Special Collections

Visit our collection of rare books and manuscripts dating back to 1471. Some 120,000 books and 3 million manuscripts are available for you to explore. There is no charge to access the University's Special Collections but you will be required to apply for a Special Collections card (valid for 3 years) to be able to access them. ### Winterbourne House and Garden

The University's own Botanic Garden has recently been restored to its Edwardian Arts and Craft splendour.
