



Adding a codicil to your will

If you have a simple will, the easiest way of adding a gift to the University of Birmingham is to use a codicil. A codicil is a document that amends, rather than replaces, your will. If you have revised your will in the past you must ensure that the codicil relates to your most recent will. You can have more than one codicil to your will, but it is important that your intentions remain clear to those reading your will and codicils.

When adding a new percentage gift, make sure that all percentages included in both your will and codicil(s) add up to 100% in total.

A codicil:

- Must be signed by two witnesses
- Must **not** have witnesses who are a beneficiary in your codicil or who are the spouse of a beneficiary
- Must state the witnesses' full names and addresses
- Must be kept with your will, but not attached to it
