The Arts Building is building R16 in the Red Zone of the Campus Map

Please note that the Arts Building is not accessible via the main entrance due to campus redevelopment. You are advised to take the rear entrance at the East of the building. Another entrance to the building is through the Muirhead Tower (building R21): enter the Muirhead Tower via the north entrance, cut through Starbucks, cross the terrace, and go through the long corridor.

The rear entrance is accessible for wheelchair users via a path with low gradient. Unfortunately, due to the campus redevelopment, we are unable to give more information on accessibility of the campus, since the situation changes regularly. Please contact us for up to date information.

The workshop will take place in rooms G13 (workshop) and G14 (breaks and lunch). These rooms are located at the end of the corridor at your right hand side if you enter the building through the rear entrance. Both rooms are accessible to wheelchair users.

Restrooms:

- Women's rooms are located in the other corridor, across the reception area.
- An all-gender restroom, also accessible to wheelchair users and including a baby changing facility is also located in the other corridor, across the reception area.
- Men's rooms are located opposite the workshop rooms in the same corridor.
