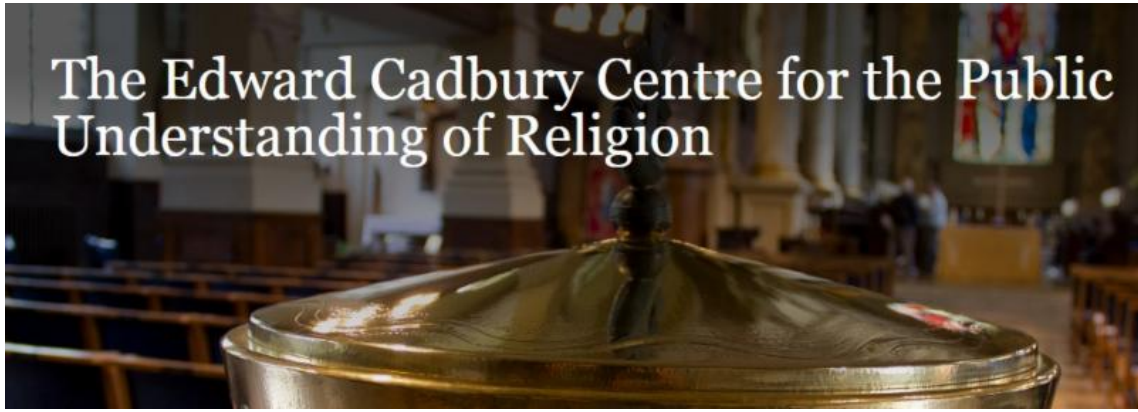

Professor Francis Davis [was appointed](#) to the Office for Disability Issues. In his new role, Professor Francis Davis will work to promote social enterprise and improve employment opportunities for disabled people.

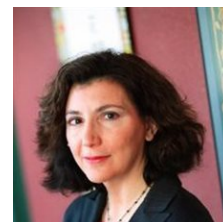
