Expansion in PD GEN recruitment

Recruitment to PD GEN has accelerated in the last 6 months thanks to the support of the Dementias and Neurodegenerative Diseases Research Network (DeNDRoN). DeNDRoN research nurses have speeded up obtaining blood samples in the 50% of England that has Local Research Networks. Over the next 6 months, Comprehensive Research Networks (CRN) will be created throughout all areas of England. For those of you without DeNDRoN support, watch out for your local CRN developing so



that you can apply early for the support you need. Now would be a good time to discuss this with your Research and Development Department who may know more about what is happening about CRNs in your area.

New technician – normal service will be resumed shortly!

We apologise for the delays in getting PD GEN packs out to some areas. The demand has been so great that the existing system could not cope. Professor Morrison has appointed a new technician who will be responsible for sending out the packs in a more timely manner and processing the samples.

Collection sites

The protocol and thus the ethics approval for PD GEN allows investigators and their medical and nursing colleagues to collect blood samples from patients and carers anywhere in the hospital environment where they will be covered by NHS indemnity. The protocol also allows for collection by the general practitioner.

Collection of samples by research nurses in the patient's home is NOT covered by the protocol or ethics approval and it is unlikely that NHS indemnity would cover such a practise. The PD GEN Management Committee considered including this collection method in a protocol amendment but, on the advice of colleagues who have been through a similar process with MND, we decided that this would be an unnecessarily long and complex process. It seems more efficient to bring groups of patients to centralised clinics to take PD GEN samples rather than to visit patients individually.



Central banking of PD GEN samples

You may be aware that the PD GEN samples are transferred from the Molecular Neurology Unit, University of Birmingham, to an MRCfunded central repository in the University of Manchester called the UK DNA Banking Network. It is from here that samples will be distributed to investigators who have approval from the PD GEN Management Committee to use the samples. The MRC has recently announced continued support for the UK DNA Banking Network. They are also seeking a multi-agency collaboration to create a much larger centralised repository to include a greater proportion of UK DNA sample collections.
