
We have been hampered by a technical hitch in SystmOne practices, but we are hopeful of an imminent start date.

23 GP Practices have been recruited – one to pilot initial programme, and 22 to run the programme. We have preliminary data from initial programme sweeps in 11 practices, with a combined population of 82,318 patients:

Initial electronic sweeps	number
Number of practices	11
Total patients' records checked electronically	82,318
Total patients flagged up	486
Patients in study age (60-79) flagged up	299

Of 299 patients identified as eligible on the initial sweep, around half (52%) had already been referred for further investigation. Around a quarter (24%) of patients identified by the programme may benefit from a check—up for bowel disease, with 15% definitely eligible.

Our next challenge is to see how quickly we can get eligible patients seen and then referred as appropriate.
