## DEVELOPING WISDOM GPS AS WISE ETHICAL DECISION MAKERS



GPs must demonstrate high level skills in managing complex clinical and ethical decisions, but little is known about how we develop these wise decision-making skills. This session findings on the development of wise decision-making by GPs. presents

This three-year project, funded by the AHRC, is in its final phase. 131 doctors at different career stages were interviewed, along with data collected from direct workplace observations, reflective diaries and community focus groups. This is the first empirical study of wisdom development (known as Phronesis) in doctors, and we used a qualitative narrative methodology. The GPs interviewed described their own journeys to wise decision making, and these journeys were then analysed using two established analytical frameworks.



We found that GPs used both a describable process (which we show) and a deeper, more nuanced set of 15 ethical decision components to arrive at wise decisions, including the balancing of the need to negotiate and to have honest/difficult conversations with trust,
