The Housing and Communities Research Group, led by Professor David Mullins, is part of the School of Social Policy at the University of Birmingham. With a team of professors, senior research fellows, lecturers and PhD students, the group draws on a wide range of skills and expertise. In addition to the large scale projects, the group also work with practitioners and industry on short-term consultancy projects (1 to 4 month projects) on our core themes and fields of interest including:

- Housing solutions for low and middle income communities
- Role of organisational design, governance and partnerships
- Social housing, Community led housing, Self- help housing and Cooperatives
- Role of Private Rented Sector in housing low and middle income households
- Social Lettings Agencies to secure decent private rented accommodation for homeless and housing options referrals from local authorities
- Choice based Lettings conditionality and need in social housing allocations
- Homelessness, young peoples' housing options, youth homelessness
- Generation rent the expanding role of private renting for younger households
- Community led engagement, Community investment and financial inclusion
- Renewing older housing and empty homes
- Governance and leadership of housing organisations
- Non-profit sector housing
- Social enterprises in housing
- Civil society and housing
