- Leadership programmes directed at different parts of the sector
- Serving different purposes, but reproduce 'heroic leadership'
- What do they seek to achieve and how do we know they are working?

 If we agree we should be improving leadership, there are some critical barriers

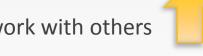
- Coordinating funders and a crowded 'provider' landscape
