## Foundation Progression Requirements (2018-19) - Social Sciences, Business and Law

These requirements apply to student completing the foundation programme in the academic year 2018-19. Upon successful completion of the Foundation in Social Sciences, Business and Law you will be guaranteed a place on one of the following degree programmes, subject to meeting the progression requirements listed below. Unless otherwise stated, the undergraduate degrees listed below are 3 year programmes (you would therefore study for a total of 4 years including the Foundation year). It is possible to progress to one of our four-year undergraduate programmes, for example, an MEng or MSci. Students wishing to progress to a 4-year UG programme would transfer at the end of the foundation year or during their UG degree and will need to apply for an extension of their studies.

\* You will be assigned an appropriate English module once you have started the course and you will need to gain the listed mark in this module to progress.

Your average is based on all modules taken and weighted according to the credit value of the module.
