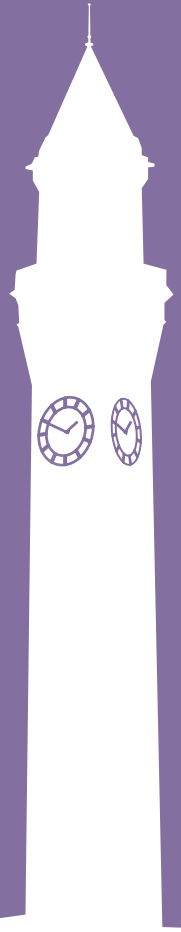

◀ Birmingham is consistently ranked in *The Telegraph's* Top 10 most beautiful campuses.

Birmingham was the first civic or 'redbrick' university, established to support the ambitions of its home city.

▼ The Bramall building, where we hold our Introduction to the University of Birmingham Talks on Open Day is also the site of comedy nights and concerts to suit a range of tastes and interests from jazz to classical music and theatre.



◀ Visit the Lapworth Museum of Geology, a runner-up for Art Fund Museum of the Year 2017, the world's largest and most prestigious prize for museums.



Maybe you've already figured this out, but we have a railway station right here on campus, which will get you into the exciting city centre in under ten minutes or into our beautiful local countryside in 20.



▼ Our new sports club caters for everyone, from beginners to elite athletes, it even has a rock climbing wall and Birmingham's first 50m swimming pool!

▲ Eleven Nobel Prize winners, who are amongst our staff and alumni, have researched and made discoveries in our very own labs and libraries. This includes three who were awarded prizes in 2016 for Physics and Chemistry.



▲ Take a walk under Old Joe (the clock face at the top is so large, you could drive a double-decker bus through it), however you won't see current students follow you through; one of the campus myths is that if you walk under Old Joe as he chimes, you'll fail your exams!

Look out for a pair of peregrine falcons who have made themselves at home at the top of the clock tower.

How to reach the University



CATCH THE TRAIN FROM BIRMINGHAM NEW STREET STRAIGHT TO UNIVERSITY STATION IN EIGHT MINUTES



By rail

Being the only university in mainland UK with its own station, the easiest way to reach the University is by train. Most cross-country services to Birmingham arrive at Birmingham New Street station and up to six trains an hour depart for University on the cross-city line (final destination Longbridge or Redditch). The journey time usually takes less than ten minutes, while the centre of the main campus is a five-minute walk from University station. Student ambassadors (wearing lime green shirts) will be present at Birmingham New Street station to direct you. Your final destination for purchasing train tickets will be 'University (Birmingham)'.



LIMITED PARKING

Parking on campus is currently very limited due to several major building projects that are taking place as part of our £600 million campus redevelopment. As the majority of visitors will be unable to park, we strongly recommend where possible, for visitors to use public transport.

Parking on campus

Parking on open days is extremely limited and the majority of visitors will be unable to find a space on campus. We therefore recommend that visitors use public transport to reach the University or find alternative parking in and around the city. The University has two main car parks: North East (B15 2SA), and Pritchatts Car Park (B15 2QU) (free of charge); parking will also be available at the West Car Park (near the Medical School) on Vincent Drive. Please note that these are used by staff and students and fill up very quickly and therefore we cannot guarantee a space for visitors.



PARK AND RIDE

In addition to University parking we are operating a park and ride service (free of charge) with some limited parking at:

- ❑ **King Edwards School playing field (B29 7JX).** The playing field is a left turn (if approaching from the city centre) on the Bristol Road, just before the Eastern Road turn.
- ❑ **Edgbaston Cricket Ground (B5 7QU).** Please use the main entrance off Edgbaston Road.

Shuttle buses to and from the University will be running throughout the day, dropping off and picking up from outside University Centre (R23 on the campus map). The first park and ride will leave both sites at 8.30am. The last bus will leave University Centre at 4.30pm.

Campus developments

THE UNIVERSITY IS INVESTING OVER £600 MILLION ACROSS FIVE YEARS IN NEW FACILITIES FOR STUDENTS AND RESEARCHERS. IN THE PAST YEAR WE HAVE OPENED A BRAND NEW STATE-OF-THE-ART LIBRARY, STUDENT HUB AT THE HEART OF CAMPUS IN OUR ICONIC ASTON WEBB BUILDING, NEW ACCOMMODATION, AND AN INSTITUTE OF TRANSLATIONAL MEDICINE.



We are in the midst of one of the most exciting and transformational campus redevelopments since 1909, investing over £600 million across a five-year period to create outstanding new facilities for our students and researchers. In the past year we have opened a state-of-the-art library, stunning student accommodation and a world-class sports club.

Visit our outstanding new library today at the centre of campus, which has been designed for learning in the 21st century and beyond. The technology-rich facility caters for different styles of study enhanced by innovative features such as wireless charging, media rooms and video editing booths. With over 1,800 seats, there are group study rooms, quiet reading areas, a lounge and café, and over 300 PCs, plus 100 loanable laptops. This is the first library of its kind to be built at any UK university in a generation. Our £55 million sports club is also open for you to explore. University of Birmingham Sport & Fitness boasts a 50m swimming pool, a large multi-sports arena, six glass-backed squash courts, a 10m climbing wall, five activity studios and a Performance Centre. There are also almost 200 pieces of high-end gym equipment and open training space.

We have even more developments in the pipeline, some of which you will benefit from the minute you start as a University of Birmingham student. We are continually improving the availability of high-end student accommodation across campus. Already we have unveiled the new Chamberlain hall of residence, and opened our Bournbrook residence this Autumn term. With 178 rooms, the residence boasts en-suite rooms, a café, accommodation centre and sports pavilion. Whilst a student, you will see the opening of the Collaborative Teaching Laboratory which will revolutionise the way STEM subjects are taught, and give students access to a wet lab, dry lab and e-lab. In 2019, a striking new 12-acre parkland will also transform the heart of the campus; the Green Heart.

Check-in at open day

CHECK-IN

All visitors are required to check-in on the day. In order to do so, please pre-register online at www.birmingham.ac.uk/opendays. In the days leading up to open day you will receive an email from us with your own personalised event ticket. The ticket will include a QR code which we will use to check you in on the day. Below is a step-by-step guide to your on the day check-in.

- 1** WHEN YOU RECEIVE YOUR EVENT TICKET VIA EMAIL, PLEASE **PRINT IT OFF** IF YOU HAVE ACCESS TO A PRINTER, AS HANDING YOUR TICKET IN IS QUICKER AND MAY HELP YOU BEAT ANY QUEUES. ALTERNATIVELY, WE CAN SCAN YOUR TICKET FROM A SMARTPHONE.
- 2** WHEN YOU ARRIVE ON CAMPUS, **VISIT ONE OF OUR FOUR CHECK-IN/INFORMATION POINTS** (SEE CAMPUS MAP FOR LOCATIONS) AND **HAND IN** YOUR EVENT TICKET TO CHECK-IN TO OPEN DAY.
- 3** AS RECEIPT OF YOUR CHECK-IN ON THE DAY, YOU WILL **RECEIVE** A UNIVERSITY OF BIRMINGHAM BAG TO HELP YOU COLLECT INFORMATION/LITERATURE THROUGHOUT THE DAY.
- 4** IF YOU NEED TO RUSH OFF TO YOUR FIRST TALK OR ACTIVITY WHEN YOU ARRIVE ON CAMPUS, DON'T WORRY, **YOU CAN CHECK-IN** WHEN YOU HAVE A SPARE FEW MINUTES.

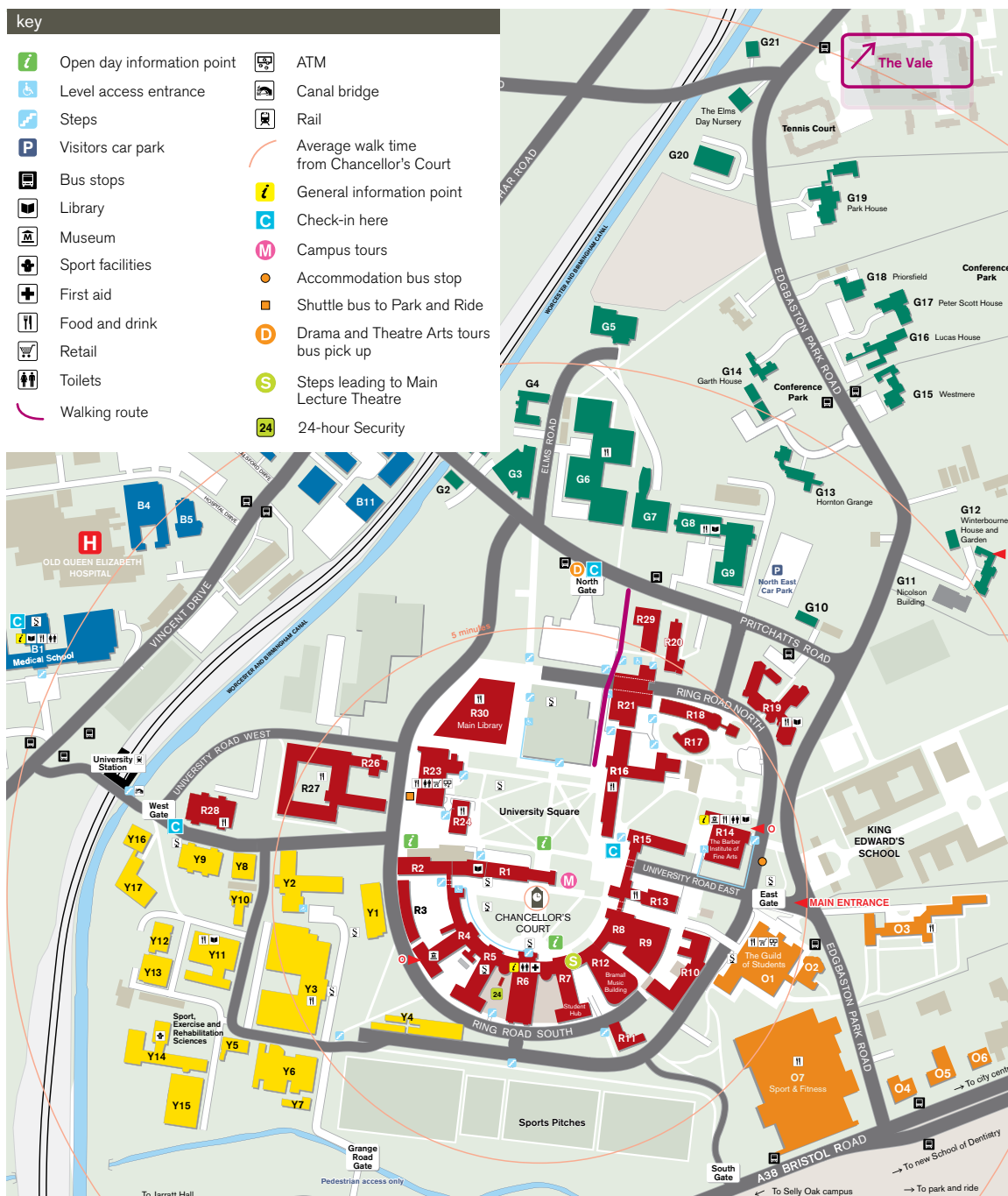
