## **British Gymnastics**

It is anticipated that the successful candidate would be located with the British Gymnastics Sports Science and Medicine Team based at Lilleshall National Sports Centre. The role of this student will contribute to the achievement of the aims and objectives of British Gymnastics and the English Institute of Sport through:

- Participating in projects and applied research by data collection and analysis within assignments devised by the BG Physiotherapy team
- Maintain bespoke feedback templates and workflows to enable sharing of data in an interdisciplinary way
- To co-ordinate / and be responsible for key data entry / processing / basic standardised report formulation across all the medical team to contribute to the audit of injury
- Collaborating with the EIS and British Gymnastic staff to create a world class high performance training environment
- Participating as part of a multi-disciplinary team to support the delivery of Physiotherapy services to athletes and coaches

## **Paralympic Sport**

It is anticipated that the successful candidate would be located with English Institute of Sport Physiotherapists working in Elite Paralympic Sport. The role of this student will contribute to the further understanding of the Paralympic athlete and the aims and objectives of the English Institute of Sport through:

- Participating in projects and applied research by data collection and analysis within assignments devised by the Paralympic Physiotherapy team
- Assist in the collection and analysis of data to gain greater understanding of key injuries within Elite Paralympic athletes
- Collaborating with the EIS staff to create a world class high performance training environment
- Participating as part of a multi-disciplinary team to support the delivery of Physiotherapy services to athletes and coaches across up to 3 Paralympic sports.

# MSc Advanced Manipulative Physiotherapy Programme







This programme enables exploration of the theoretical basis of manipulative physiotherapy and its application to the development of clinical reasoning. Using the process of clinical reasoning as its framework, this programme integrates the many approaches to practice in this specialist area. It facilitates an evaluation of existing evidence through the exploration of the assessment and management of musculoskeletal dysfunction.

#### Entry Requirements

Admission to the programme is on the basis that applicants will have:

- Current registration with the HCPC and CSP (includes professional indemnity insurance)
- A BSc/BA honours degree or equivalent, normally a 1<sup>st</sup> or 2.1 honours degree
- Documented evidence of a minimum of 1500 hours experience post registration of working in a neuromusculoskeletal context
- Supporting evidence of appropriate continuing professional development
- Evidence of satisfactory current DBS
- Evidence of satisfactory health declaration and immunisation record.
