

June smashed the previous record (48) for monthly recruitment with 67! **Our huge thanks to everyone** for their hard work in assuring this, it's great to see the progress of the trial and we wouldn't be here without your efforts!

TIPS: Associate PI Scheme

CaPE is registered for the NIHR's Associate PI scheme, which aims to integrate clinical research into clinical training, and develop health care professionals to be PIs of the future. This also increases opportunities for patients to be involved in research, to help improve care—win, win for all concerned!

As CaPE is a CTIMP study, a medically qualified doctor needs to assess women for eligibility. It can be challenging sometimes to have enough doctors that are GCP and study trained to help with this. You can provide incentive to doctors by offering them an Associate PI position for CaPE. Junior doctors are great for this role because learning how to deliver an NIHR portfolio trial is good for their experience and CVs. In turn they can help with recruitment, and also enthuse and train other doctors to recruit for CaPE.

If your site does not currently have an Associate PI, please do consider this scheme, and discuss it with your local PI as they would need to be willing to support and mentor the role.
