Hello! Thank you for all your work on the study this month and your continued effort in helping answer this important research question.

We have been thinking hard about what makes a real difference to randomised recruitment as we currently need to increase our monthly recruitment. If all sites met their target, we would be flying. Our 2 key tips to making a real difference to increasing monthly randomisations are:

- ⇒ Ensuring you are finding and approaching as many eligible women as possible. Finding them as early as possible in pregnancy will give you more opportunities to discuss the study with them. More than 50% of women approached to take part in the randomised study say yes. This is higher, over 80%, at some sites so there is definitely a 'knack' to approaching women.
- ⇒ Ensuring your doctors and research team are comfortable talking to women about the study, particularly those who are already on medication. See the Giant PANDA study resources below and please get in touch if you think your site would benefit from a 'Hypertension update' teaching session delivered by one of our team.

Can we help support you to get every site recruiting over the next couple of months? We know that when you get into the swing of it, then recruitment tends to fly.

New trainees can be a valuable asset in recruiting to the giant PANDA study and tend to be a captive audience on their arrival in a new maternity unit!

Consider how you might get them on board from day 1:

- ⇒ Can you do a research pitch/session in their orientation? No need to give all the detail of the trial... just tell them the study rationale and how to contact your team each time they are writing an antihypertensive prescription!
- ⇒ Make sure they have a copy of the 'What you need to know...before prescribing antihypertensives in pregnancy' memo
- ⇒ Would they benefit from a hypertension update + discussion about the giant PANDA study? Get in touch with us, we are happy to deliver a teaching session as part of a meeting/ their routine teaching or as something separate.
- $\Rightarrow$  Are any keen on doing their GCP and helping you consent and randomise into the study?
