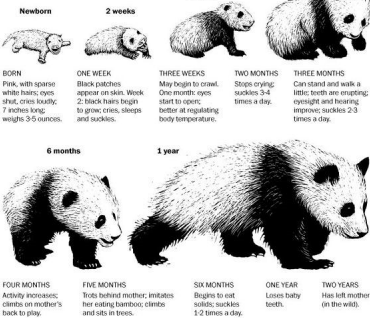

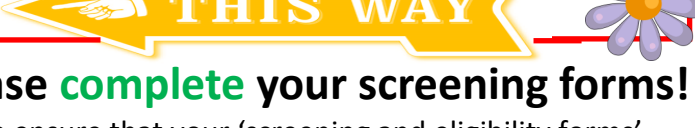

The giant PANDA study has been open 1 year! 30 Trusts are now open and 380 participants have been randomised. We are very happy to report that we been giving the go ahead beyond our pilot. ## Please complete your screening forms!

Please ensure that your 'screening and eligibility forms' are always accurate at the time of completion and save them as 'complete'. By doing this, we will always know how many women are in the study at any one time, how many have declined and how many have been considering. This form can be updated as many times as you require, so if the situation changes (e.g. the woman decides to consent to the study, having previously declined).

## Introducing the... 'change in study status' form

- The woman has transferred care to another unit, but outcomes may still be available
- The woman has given birth/ the pregnancy has ended (e.g. TOP, miscarriage, stillbirth, neonatal death). Any baby deaths more than 24 weeks should be reported to study team as an SAE (within less than 24 hours of becoming aware).
- The woman has had a new fetal abnormality detected and is happy to continue
- The woman has died. Please report to study team as an SAE (within less than 24 hours of becoming aware)
- The woman's maternity notes are (partially) missing
- A clinician has deemed the woman no longer has the capacity to consent
- The woman does not wish to complete ongoing online questionnaires
- The woman is receiving care at this maternity unit but is not responding to any contact
- The woman has transferred care to another unit and outcomes not available
- The woman is uncontactable and is no longer receiving care at unit
- The woman has been enrolled in the study but is ineligible (i.e. does not meet the study eligibility criteria)
- The woman specifically states that she is withdrawing consent for ongoing data collection (including case notes review)

- ⇒ This form can be found on REDCap within the participant's eCRF (far right of the screen).
- ⇒ If there is **any missing data or any possibility of missing data** (baseline AND/OR two-week follow-up AND/OR outcome data), please proactively **tell us why using this form**, e.g. given birth earlier than expected, lost to follow-up, transferred care, missing notes, etc.
- ⇒ Completing this form will stop us chasing you for outcomes when they are not going to be completed.
- ⇒ This form can be updated as many times as required if the situation changes.
- ⇒ This form is a lost-to-follow-up, discontinuation, and withdrawal form combined.

## Over half of eligible women approached about the giant PANDA study, say YES to randomisation. In some of our sites, this is much higher.

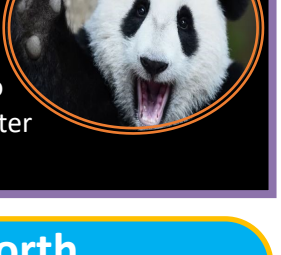
- "It is okay to say you don't know [which antihypertensive is best]"
- "Let us make it [their choice of antihypertensive] randomised, not random"
- Work as an MDT to identify and approach women
- Use the high blood pressure in pregnancy decision aids

- Keep Giant PANDA top of mind at your maternity unit!
  - o Arrange an update with the giant PANDA team, your research team and your trainees/ consultants
  - o Present regularly at meetings (e.g. clinical governance, consultant meeting, trainee orientation)
  - o Get an Associate PI <https://www.nihr.ac.uk/health-and-care-professionals/career-development/associate-principal-investigator-scheme.htm>
  - o Put quick reference guide to Giant PANDA on antenatal clinic desks
  - o Send out emails to women who may be caring for women with hypertension in pregnancy
  - o Pop in to areas regularly to remind staff what the trial is about and who you are targeting
- Try to understand why a clinician doesn't want a woman to be randomised
  - o "What makes you think that this woman shouldn't be randomised?"
  - o "Can I tell you a bit about the background and rationale for the Giant PANDA Study?"

## Tip of the month

If a participant has only partially completed a survey (saved in orange + white tick = ) the return code can be used to re-enter and complete the survey. Open the survey on REDCap, note down the 'return code' and then ask the participant to complete in person/ via email/ via phone. You will need to enter the return code to open the partially completed survey.
