



Pregnancy ANtihypertensive Drugs: which Agent is best?

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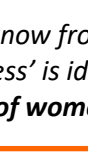


We are now in our second November of the study and have 41 sites open! This is an incredible number of sites and we are so pleased to have such a large and diverse team. Every site has an important part to play in working towards our randomisation target. A few more top tips for you to consider as a team what you can do to:

- ⇒ Boost your team's confidence in talking to women about the lack of adequate evidence for labetalol and nifedipine and how the giant PANDA study is seeking to change this
- ⇒ Ensure that you have as many staff trained and willing to support the study as possible. Consider getting more trainees involved in identifying eligible women—remember they don't need to be GCP trained or on the delegation log, just providing their usual clinical care.
- ⇒ Find and approach all eligible women at your maternity unit. Work with your colleagues to remind them there are very few absolute contraindications to [labetalol/ nifedipine](#). We don't know which one is best in pregnancy and our women deserve to have evidence to guide their choices. Let's make their experience count.

We as a team are very happy to support you with this. We have found that site teaching sessions and discussions with us and the wider Giant PANDA team really help teams to offer the trial to more women and increase participation. Many sites who have engaged with us have become more successful in the following months. **Get in touch, attend a teleconference or attend one of the PI drop-in sessions to discuss!**

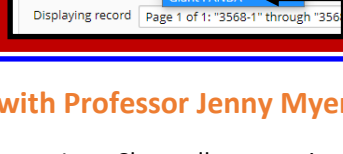


REDCap Update 1

Boosting your two-week follow-up completion!

Check below to see the % of two-week follow-ups completed at your maternity unit. If its highlighted in 'orange', its currently less than 100%.

Please ensure 100% of two-week follow-ups are completed or record the reason (on the 'change in study status' form on REDCap) as to why it has not been able to be completed. Women in the randomised and observational arms should complete all follow-ups.

Ensure the woman at the time of consent understands:

- ⇒ Why the two-week follow-up is so important to the study
 - ⇒ It provides the woman's perspective on the antihypertensive medication she has been prescribed (e.g. side effects, satisfaction, how she takes it, etc.)
 - ⇒ When she should expect to receive it and complete it by.
 - ⇒ Ensure you have entered the woman's correct mobile number and email in REDCap
 - ⇒ The link to the two-week follow-up will automatically be sent two-weeks after consent (to the second!) by REDCap to her mobile phone. It can be completed up until the next follow-up is due (i.e. up until 6 weeks post consent) but ideally as close to two weeks as possible
 - ⇒ Ensure she knows that she should still complete the follow-ups even if she has not started/switched / added to her randomised medication.
- Ensure you have a robust system in place to ensure it will be completed:
- ⇒ Put a reminder in your team diary at 2 weeks +2 days to check REDCap to see if she has completed. If she has, there will be a green tick
 - ⇒ The participant can complete the follow-up survey via sms survey link or in person (e.g. in clinic) over the phone, or via email survey link. Open the survey in REDCap and click on 'survey options'
 - ⇒ The follow-up can be translated by the research team using routine translation services (e.g. Language Line) for women who require a translator
 - ⇒ If the participant does not complete the follow-up within the timeframe, please complete the 'change in study status' form to record why by due date + 4 weeks.
