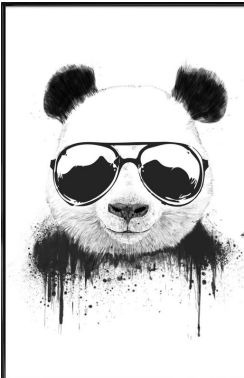
Hello Autumn!

Emphasize that the study is embedded in usual clinical care. Antihypertensive medications can be stopped/ switched/ added to at any point and the participant remains in the study. The study is capturing women's experience of the medication.

FAQs this month

Should we include women who have been prescribed a 'stat' dose of antihypertensive?

Eligibility for Giant PANDA includes 'A clinician has decided to initiate or continue use of antihypertensive drugs?' this refers to a 'regular antihypertensive (AHA) medication. We are aware of women presenting with high blood pressure having serial BP measurements conducted until their BP measures under threshold for treatment or given a 'stat' dose of antihypertensive meds and then sent home to see how their BP is in the coming days. We would encourage PIs and research teams to question care plans like this, as high blood pressure is unlikely to be temporary and therefore effective treatment and reduction of risk may be being delayed.

Can Clinical Trials Assistants (CTAs) take consent for Giant PANDA?

We absolutely welcome the support from our CTAs colleagues but to note that unfortunately CTAs cannot take consent for Giant PANDA as this was not explicitly included in our IRAS form.
