## RaDaR

We are very happy to have the support of the National Registry of Rare Kidney Diseases (RaDaR), a Renal Association initiative designed to pull together information from patients with certain rare kidney conditions, such as chronic kidney disease in pregnancy. These women are eligible for inclusion in WILL as long as they have no evidence of superimposed pre-eclampsia and meet other inclusion/exclusion criteria. # Consent forms

Consent can be obtained by any GCP trained doctor, midwife or nurse named on the site signature and delegation log (as per local policy).

All sections of the consent form need to be initialled, signed, name printed and dated by the woman.

We will be providing carbon copies of the consent form and will send sites further copies when they are running low. The original (white) copy should be sent to the WILL trial team at BCTU, either by post (envelopes provided) or by email to WILLtrial@nhs.net account from an nhs.net email.

A further copy should be given to the woman, a copy placed in the woman's maternity notes (or scanned electronically onto her notes), and a copy placed in the site file.

# FAQ

**Q.** Can women be offered membrane sweeps before 40 weeks if they are in the expectant care arm of WILL?

**A.** Membrane sweeping is a form of induction, and although not as effective as pharmacological or other mechanical means, it should not be done before 40 weeks in the expectant care arm. It should also not be relied upon as a reliable form of induction in the planned early term birth group. Please record on the Delivery Page of the database if it is performed, whether successful or not.
