'Spotlight' on Leicester Royal Infirmary Tea Trolley teaching

We visited Leicester Royal Infirmary on the 17th January and heard all about their 'Tea Trolley' teaching sessions that they do to promote research in their unit. Armed with tea and biscuits (see photo on left) the research team visits clinical areas and chats with staff. What a great way to promote research!

Hypertension midwife: Claire Dodd

Claire (pictured left) has worked as a specialist midwife in hypertension at University Hospitals Leicester (UHL) for the last 21 years. We asked Claire to tell us more about her exciting role:

'My role involves overseeing all women with hypertension during pregnancy, either in clinics or on the wards, ordering tests, checking results, arranging monitoring etc. We have a very well-established (over 20 years) home blood pressure monitoring service for women both antenatally and postnatally. Myself and my colleague, Andrea, also run a midwifery-led debriefing clinic 8-12 weeks postnatally for any woman who has had severe pre-eclampsia, delivered before 34 weeks or required magnesium sulphate.

Midwifery research team at UHL:

Our model is quite unique in that all the team are part clinical and part research. Most of the team work one or two days a week on research as well as their clinical commitments. I only work 2 days a month as a research midwife. But I have found that this combined role has been extremely beneficial to recruitment for the WILL trial as I am able to identify suitable women from quite an early gestation. Being able to talk to these women about the study early gives them plenty of opportunity for questions and then decide if the study is right for them'.

Database: Completing eCRFs

'Reconfirmation of Eligibility and Randomisation' form for women that cannot or do not want to be randomised

- Some women who consent to take part in WILL will not be able to be randomised once they reach 37⁺⁰ 37⁺⁶ weeks as the clinical need for delivery develops. While this is uncommon (<10% of women to date), it is anticipated. Also, some women may change their minds, something that has not happened to date in WILL.
- Please **remember** that you still need to complete this form above, which can be opened by clicking on the 'Patient' then 'Randomise patient' tab.
- This form <u>must</u> be completed <u>before</u> 38 weeks, as currently the form on the database will no longer be available once this gestation is reached. Please get in touch with us if you need to fill in the form but no longer have access.

'Delivery' form

One of the indications for delivery offered in the WILL database is 'maternal hypertension not controlled by maximal therapy'.

While there is no agreed definition of 'maximal therapy', in common clinical practice, this would usually mean **three** antihypertensive agents in high doses. It would not mean one agent, even in high dose. We recognise that this may not be straightforward, so if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to give us a call.

Amending Data:

- If you need to amend any data on a CRF, please check if the form is 'locked'.
- If the form is 'locked', please contact BCTU to request an 'unlock'.
- If you change/amend data before the form is unlocked, it will appear that changes have been made, but the from will not save the changes that have been made.


FAQs
