WILL is PAUSED due to COVID-19

We aim to resume WILL as soon as possible, when elective work resumes in the NHS. This may be as late as September 2020, but we will be reassessing this monthly and will keep you updated.

Recruitment update for March

As of the 20th March 2020, we had 90 women consented and 84 women randomised in WILL!! It looked like March was on track to be our best month ever as when we paused WILL, we already had 13 participants so far!

It was fantastic that St Mary's Maternity Unit, Poole consented 2 and randomised 3 participants and **Bradford Royal Infirmary** consented and randomised **2** participants.

Congratulations also to the teams at; Croydon University Hospital, Liverpool Women's Hospital, Queens Medical Centre and City Hospital Nottingham, St Thomas' Hospital, Princess Anne, Southampton, North West Anglia NHS Foundation Trust, Singleton Hospital Swansea for consenting and randomising 1 participant each to WILL.

WILL Participants:

Women who have not yet delivered in either arm:

Please can you help to ensure that women taking part in WILL who have not yet delivered still carry on with their participation, whether they are in the planned early term delivery arm or planned expectant care arm.

• Once these women are delivered, please can you complete outcome data ASAP?

• Please still report any SAEs, trial withdrawals or protocol deviations if they occur for relevant participants. The WILL team will see them and be in touch.

• Don't forget to let us know if you are having any difficulties due to staffing levels so that we can provide support.

Please note that whilst WILL is paused, 'Randomisation' has been locked on the database, but all other data input is still active and you can resolve queries.

Database:

During this time, Ruth and Katie will be checking through all of the data that have been entered on the database. We understand fully that you may find it difficult to complete data outcomes or check and respond to any queries raised. However, if you are able to, please could you:

• Check and complete any outstanding data for all participants (including women who could not be randomised).



• Check for and respond to any data queries that have been raised.

Research staff availability at sites:

Please keep in touch if you can and let us know how you are doing. It will be great to hear from you.

If possible, please could you let us know the names of your research team members who are still available and any new contact details?

This information will ensure that the WILL team contact you at convenient times during this phase of WILL.

Main phase: new plan

Once we know when we can re-open WILL at our existing pilot sites and at new sites, we will be in touch. Our plan for reopening sites is:

Existing pilot sites: We will arrange to deliver 'WILL refresher training' to all of our existing sites via conference facilities such as Zoom, telephone conference call or if needed, at a site visit.

New sites: It is hoped that we can start arranging our first SIV visits in September/October this year. As we have had to postpone some SIV visits, we aim to rearrange these first with those sites and then to start contacting other sites to arrange SIV dates.

We will keep you updated and Sue and Julie will be in contact as soon as they can. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to get in touch.

Site 'remote' monitoring visits:

Katie is currently unable to visit sites that have had 5 or more participants to carry out an onsite monitoring visit. Therefore, she is looking at ways of monitoring as much data as possible remotely. She will be in touch with you shortly.


