- Flexible mode of delivery to suit both learner and employer needs through a blend of online and on-campus delivery
- Modular delivery limits the impact of study on work commitments with modules consisting of 2.5 days face-to-face learning and 6-7 weeks of online learning
- Enrolment on the programme enables learners to build new networks and connections, develop as system leaders and work with new ideas and approaches to solve organisational challenges
- In addition to their Degree Apprenticeship, the University provides apprentices with membership of the Chartered Management Institute for the duration of the programme and one year afterwards as either Chartered Managers or Chartered Fellows

OVERVIEW

The Health Services Management Centre (HSMC) is one of the UK's leading centres for research, teaching, professional development and consultancy to health and social care agencies. HSMC has pioneered innovative approaches to personal and professional education, delivering multi award winning national leadership programmes that have made a real difference to the working lives of staff and have improved patient care and experience across all health and care settings.

Drawing on theory, research, and comparative analysis of international health systems our Health and Care System Leadership Level 7 Degree Apprenticeship programme provides a basis for understanding and achieving the 'building blocks' of high quality care: well-trained and motivated staff, efficient use of resources, a culture of improvement, and an ability to integrate care. Teaching is delivered in collaboration with the Department of Social Work and Social Care at the University, providing a unique and integrated perspective on systems leadership.

The programme takes participants through development processes intended to equip them with the theoretical knowledge and personal skills to understand the health and care environment, improve integrated working on the frontline, and assesses ways to achieve more efficient and person-centred services.

Different modules examine the strategic, political and policy context of systems leadership in health and care. A range of areas are covered that include assessing need and demand for services; improving quality and safety; innovation and change; leading and developing people; and stakeholder involvement in planning, commissioning, and purchasing activities. Learners will be introduced to key national and international research including lessons from other areas of public service.

SUCCESS AND IMPACT

The University is currently offering Degree Apprenticeship programmes with a number of partners across both the private and public sectors, in business, local government and the NHS against the following Apprenticeship Standards:

- Level 6 Digital and Technology Solutions Professional
- Level 7 Senior Leader

The University is continuing to develop further programmes against a number of additional Apprenticeship Standards and our offer for partners continues to grow.
