- (a) the draft EDI Strategy was a statement of the University's commitment to equality and fair treatment. It encompassed the University's legal duties under the Equality Act 2010 Public Sector Equality Duty to take action to promote equality and prevent discrimination across the protected characteristics, and to publish equality objectives in support of this Duty every 4 years;
- (b) the proposed five priority EDI areas for 2025-2028 were:
 - (i) reducing the success and progression gaps amongst the student population;
 - (ii) reducing the staff gender and ethnicity pay gaps;
 - (iii) increasing the diversity of staff who hold senior leadership positions;
 - (iv) recruiting, retaining and promoting a more diverse range of staff;
 - (v) enhancing the consistency of student and staff experiences;
- (c) to address and make progress across these priority areas, the Strategy was structured around inter-linked themes and associated strands of activity: Challenging barriers to equality; Creating inclusive learning and working cultures; Embedding accessibility across our campuses; Incorporating EDI into our organisational structures;
- (d) the Implementation Plan which was being developed to ensure effective delivery of the Strategy would be shared with Council when it was available:
- (e) members of Council commended the progress which had been made over the past year on EDI strategy development and the proposed key priority areas, themes and strands of activity. Their discussion covered:
 - (i) the importance of increasing the diversity of staff who held senior leadership positions in the University, noting the work being done to strengthen the recruitment pipeline for these roles and the diversity of the Birmingham Anniversary Chairs and Fellows appointed to date;
 - (ii) that the Dubai campus would develop their own implementation plan to set out their contribution to meeting the EDI Strategy targets;
 - (iii) the need to continue to convey why EDI was important for the University, especially given the recent position on DEI taken by the new administration in the US.
